BLACK-TYPE SPOTLIGHT



Addictive Mature

Off the back of a staggering 19 stakes winners last season, Savabeel has wasted no time making his mark on 2017-18, with son Addictive Nature taking out the honours in last weekend's Gr.3 Ming Dynasty Quality at Rosehill for trainer Bjorn Baker.

The Savabeel colt showed his class with a bold front-running display, enabling his trainer to now confidently consider a Group One move with the Sean Buckley, A Kheir & Dr. Toby Koenig-owned three-year-old.

"I thought it was a good effort – he's still doing a few things upside down, but he's got plenty of untapped potential," Baker said.

"He's always shown a lot, he's a high-priced yearling (\$775,000) and he's one of the best looking horses I've ever trained or ever been involved with. We're lucky to have a horse like this and great to see him win like that.

"We'll see how he recovers first thing, but regardless of what happens, we're yet to see the best of him. He's been up for a while, but there's a pretty good race here in a couple of weeks we'll definitely have to take a look at (Gr.1 Golden Rose)."

Addictive Nature was bred by ABP Enterprises Ltd, Little Avondale Trust & Storm Thoroughbreds Ltd and is out of the Carnegie mare, Generous Nature – a mare who has already produced the Savabeel Australian G2 winner Savvy Nature.

Addictive Nature was Savabeel's 65th individual Stakes winner.



Bonny O'Reilly

Bonny O'Reilly completed an excellent day at Rosehill for WS and for trainer Bjorn Baker. The home-bred and sold daughter of O'Reilly made a successful return following a spell and replicated the earlier effort of her stablemate Addictive Nature, a Savabeel colt who won the Gr.3 Ming Dynasty Quality.

In her first appearance since May, Bonny O'Reilly resumed with a strong performance to score over 1200 metres. The fiveyear-old has now fashioned the tidy record of nine wins - which

include a Listed win in the BRC Helen Coughlan Stakes, and two minor placings from her 13 starts.

She was purchased out of WS's 2014 Premier Sale draft to Karaka by Baker and bloodstock agent Michael Wallace for \$100,000. She is out of the Pins mare Pretty, who is a half-sister to the dual Group One winners Glamour Puss and Vision And Power.

If successful, it would represent the Allan Sharrock-trained galloper's third consecutive win in the event.

The race has been strongly dictated to by Waikato Stud sires in the past five years, with Savabeel representing Kawi's suc-

cessful sire over the past two years, No Excuse Needed I Do, with its 2014 winner and with our resident sire Ocean Park's runaway win in 2012.

PEDIGREE POINTERS WITH GARETH DOWNEY



At just his 3rd start, Addictive Nature showed his customary tactical speed – and he also showed all the toughness and fighting qualities of a seasoned pro, to hold off all challengers in taking out the Gr.3 Ming Dynasty at Rosehill. This was a wonderful result for Sean Buckley, Dr Toby Koenig and all other connections involved in the horse. Trainer Bjorn Baker describes Addictive Nature as being as good looking a horse as he has ever been associated with, and no doubt that was a big part of the reason for the horse selling for \$775,000 as a yearling. Based on the talent being shown so early in his career, it looks like there is plenty more success in store for Addictive Nature and his connections.

The pedigree pattern behind Addictive Nature is yet another example of the success achieved when combining Zabeel and Sadler's Wells together. This combination has now been brought together, within five generations, in the pedigrees of 17 individual Gr.1 winners. Very impressively, these Gr.1 winners are being achieved at the rate of one for every 67 runners – and this is an excellent strike rate for such a large sample set, and with these two sires steadily moving further back in pedigrees.

The list of Gr.1 winners itself is also a very impressive collection – being It's A Dundeel, Pierro, Lucia Valentina, Werther, Tarzino, Laverock, Hall Of Fame, Sacred Elixir, Humidor, Tavago, Lizzie L'Amour, Fenway, Charmont, Hauraki, Gust Of Wind, Gondokoro and Zabeelionaire. As you can see, it is often the case that the best performer for a given sire carrying Zabeel or Sadler's Wells is achieved from a mating with a mare carrying the other of these.

So, is there something in the pedigree pattern for these matings that gives us a clue as to why the combination is so successful? In many cases, a successful pedigree pattern will be supported by the reinforcement of powerful female ancestors through alternative lines. In the case of combining Zabeel and Sadler's Wells, it has been well documented that the primary female duplication being achieved is that of the wonderful mare Special; through the ¾ brothers Nureyev and Sadler's Wells. This is further supported by the reinforcement of a host of other very influential mares – such as Lavendula II, Mumtaz Mahal, Selene and Simon's Shoes. Even just on this basis alone, without looking for any reinforcement of dominant male ancestors, you can see this combination of Zabeel and Sadler's Wells has always looked like a match made in equine genetic heaven – as is proving to be the case in practice.

If you have a mare carrying either Zabeel or Sadler's Wells, you have the opportunity to tap into this proven combination – and give yourself a chance of breeding the best performer by the given stallion you choose to send your mare to. If you have a mare carrying Sadler's Wells, you can achieve this pattern by sending her to either Savabeel or Ocean Park. If you have a mare carrying Zabeel, you can achieve it by sending her to Tivaci.
