After missing a start in Wednesday's Gr.3 Lady's Day Vase top Te Akau mare **Shillelagh (NZ)** (Savabeel) will step up to Group Two company in Saturday's Tristarc Stakes (1400m).

The Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards-trained five-year-old was impressive when winning at her Australian debut earlier this month but failed to gain a start on Wednesday as the second emergency.

"She's worked well since her victory at Caulfield a fortnight ago," said Te Akau's racing manager Brad Taylor.

"It was unfortunate not to get a run on Wednesday in the Group Three event. Saturday is certainly a step up in class against the likes of First Seal but we expect her to run a nice race."

Shillelagh, who has the services of Hong Kong-based Australian jockey Zac Purton, is a \$11 shot.

Savabeel gelding **Ferro Nero** could have earned himself a shot at a rich country Cup with victory in a midweek race at Caulfield.

The Nigel Blackiston-trained gelding defied his \$41 quote as he finished strongly to win Wednesday's Ladbrokes Handicap (2000m) by a head over Data Point.

Blackiston said the drop in class from his last start, a rise in distance to 2000m and a good ride from Michael Walker suited the gelding he described as quirky.

"He's always shown he's got some nice ability but doesn't always bring his A-game," Blackiston said.

"Today he was in good order, he got a lovely ride and he just attacked the line beautifully.

Blackiston said he would like to step him up further in distance.

"Obviously you've got the Bendigo Cup or the Ballarat Cup which might be nice options, or something over the Flemington carnival," he said.



LUCIA VALENTINA

The **Savabeel** mare Kerrin McEvoy hopes can deliver him an elusive Cox Plate has pleased the jockey in her first experience at Moonee Valley.

McEvoy rode **Lucia Valentina** in a solid piece of work with grand campaigner Happy Trails at Moonee Valley on Thursday morning, the Kris Lees-trained mare's first time at the unique Melbourne racetrack which hosts the Cox Plate on Saturday week.

"She got around here really well so that was pleasing. She was on her right lead and she seems really bright and well in her work," McEvoy said.

"It was good work. That was her main bit of work (going into the Cox Plate). Kris wanted a good work-out and that was what we got."

If McEvoy can win the Cox Plate on Lucia Valentina he will join an elite list of riders to have won a Melbourne Cup, Caulfield Cup, Cox Plate and Golden Slipper.

"It's a hard one to get," McEvoy said.

"So we'll be trying. A bit of rain around would suit her, but the

forgiving surface of Moonee Valley should be perfect for her.

"Obviously Winx and Hartnell seem to be going really well, but she's a weight-for-age 2000 metre winner in her own right in the autumn so you can't dismiss her lightly, that's for sure."

Lucia Valentina sat just off Happy Trails early in the 1400m workout before joining him and the pair went to the line with Happy Trails marginally ahead.

They clocked a sharp 23.79sec for the final 400m.

"It was very nice work," Lees said.

"He's always a good yardstick because he's a really good worker, Happy Trails."

Lees believes Lucia Valentina is similar to how she was leading into her biggest win in the \$4 million the Queen Elizabeth Stakes in April but acknowledges it is a strong year with Winx and Hartnell headlining the Cox Plate contenders.

SOME SERIOS FACTS

So impressive was the win of **Cannot Be Serios** when scoring on debut at Hawkesbury last Sunday, he was named Maiden Winner Of The Week by ANZ Bloodstock News. He was certainly expected to perform well after **2** very nice trials, and with a very strong market move bringing him in from **\$4.60** to start a **\$2.40** equal favourite.

Cannot Be Serios became the 13th winner for Rios, from just 20 runners. The only objective way to measure the performance of a stallion is to look at the results from his progeny, compared against the opportunity that stallion has been given by breeders.

The statistics posted by Rios to date are that he is running at 65% winners/runners and 5.0% SW/Rnrs; with that stakes winner being the Gr.1 winner Gaultier.

So, how good are these statistics when compared against the stallion population as a whole? As far as I can find advertised commercially in Australasia, there are 127 stallions standing at stud in Australasia this season who have Southern Hemisphere-conceived runners representing them. Of those 127, there are only Rios and 17 others who have achieved at least 65% winners/runners and 5.0% SW/Rnrs. Stallions with these statistics are usually the leading stallions available

at stud – and that is indeed the case currently as they include the likes of Savabeel, Pins, Fastnet Rock, Exceed and Excel, Redoute's Choice, Snitzel, Lonhro, Not A Single Doubt, More Than Ready, I Am Invincible etc – so this is a pretty impressive list that Rios has earned the right to be part of!

In terms of a pedigree pointer in the production of Cannot Be Serios, we can again see the well-renowned "nick" between Hussonet and Nijinsky. Cannot Be Serios is out of a Captain Rio mare, whose 2nd Dam is by Nijinsky. The tools provided by Arion Pedigrees enable us to run data on when Rios has been mated with mares carrying Nijinsky anywhere in their 1st four generations. The report tells us that Rios has had 8 runners from such mares, and they have resulted in 6 winners including Gaultier (Gr.1 winner in NZ and subsequent Hong Kong winner), Happy Place (winner in NZ and subsequent winner of 2 so far in Hong Kong), A Tad Leica (4 wins), Del Rios (2 wins) and Cannot Be Serios (debut winner).
