SAVABEEL BOOK CLOSED

THE 2017 'BOOK FULL' SIGN HAS GONE UP FOR SAVABEEL TODAY.

"The strong demand, especially from Australian breeders, has meant we have had to close his book," explained Mark Chittick.

"We don't want to serve more than 150 mares with him, and after another massive season, the breeder support we have received for him has been just terrific.

"This season Savabeel's had the 18 individual stakes winners and has been very dominant in the sale ring also, leading the NZ way with a Premier average of \$220,385 and selling up to \$750,000." said Chittick.

WAR AFFAIR ALL HEART IN SGP-3 SAAS FEE STAKES

The innate will to win of Singapore's former Horse of the Year, War Affair, enabled the most stirring of finishes to the Sgp-3 Saas Fee Stakes last Sunday.

Trained by Bruce Marsh, War Affair had been off the scene since his third placing in the Gr.1 Raffles Cup (1800m) in October. During Sunday's race, you would have easily been forgiven for thinking the 6YO gelding was a spent force, settling at the rear of the field with a wall of horses in front of him.

Angled into the middle at the 300m by jockey Danny Beasley, War Affair fought his way through the pack, hitting the line in an exciting three-way go with Storm Troops and Hip Hip Hooray. At the post, the photo revealed a dead-heat between War Affair and Storm Troops.

"It was a sensational win," Marsh told the Singapore Turf Club afterwards.

"I don't know what happened when he was so far back. The way the track rode today, he had to be really good to win first-up.

"But he's a horse with such a great heart. What is even more amazing is this horse has been through so much behind the scenes (latest was a wind op, hence the long layoff) and to see him win like that, it's just sensational."

The win was particularly special for War Affair's regular pilot.

"I am so proud of him. It doesn't matter if it was a dead-heat, to do what he did after what he's been through, it's pretty amazing," said Beasley.

"Nothing happened at the start; he just wanted to be at the back today, on his own.

"He did hit a wall at the 50 yard. Last time he would let go inside the last 100 yards, but his fitness blew.

"He got a head, a neck in front, and then he just picked himself off the canvas, and just threw himself at the line. It's a very special win."

PEDIGREE POINTERS WITH GARETH DOWNEY

A Mix More Potent Than Volatile



In winning the Gr.1 South Australian Derby, Volatile Mix continued the incredible success enjoyed by breeders Graham and Linda Huddy from combining High Chaparral and Pentire together in a pedigree. Their earlier prime example of this was their wonderful 5-time Gr.1 winner, Shoot Out. Shoot Out was by High Chaparral out of a Pentire mare — and Graham and Lindy successfully utilised the reverse cross to produce Volatile Mix, who has now become a Gr.1 winner at his 9th career start.

Overall, the statistics to date from combining High Chaparral and Pentire together on opposite sides of a pedigree are outstanding. There have to date been just 14 runners bred this way, and from these there have been 12 winners of 33 races. The list of stakes winners are of course Shoot Out and Volatile Mix, as well as the Morphettville Guineas winner Silvera — who, quite incredibly, was also bred and raced by Graham and Linda.

There is very strong pedigree appeal in this combination of High Chaparral and Pentire. High Chaparral is out of a mare by a son of Shirley Heights; while Pentire's granddam is a half-sister to Shirley Heights. We so often see this close reinforcement of powerful female ancestors being a catalyst for racetrack success. The pedigree appeal is further enhanced by reinforcement of the very influential mare Lalun, as well as by the sex-balanced duplication of powerful stallions such as Mill Reef, Native Dancer and Hugh Lupus. Congratulations to Graham and Linda for utilising this pedigree

pattern to such successful effect!

The other stakes winner involving High Chaparral for the week was Stampede, who took out the Gr.3 Chairman's Handicap at Doomben. Stampede is also bred on a well-proven pedigree pattern, with his dam carrying a duplication of Sir Tristram. When High Chaparral has been combined anywhere in a pedigree with Sir Tristram on the opposite side, this is to date achieving a very good 8.6% SW/Rnrs, and an exceptional strike rate of a Gr.1 winner for every 35 runners. Tivaci himself is one of these Gr.1 winners, and Sir Tristram is carried well back in the 4th generation of his pedigree so matings with mares carrying another strain of Sir Tristram should provide a positive reinforcement of this successful pattern.

Apart from Tivaci, the other stakes winners bred on this pattern of combining High Chaparral and Sir Tristram have included It's A Dundeel, Fenway, Inference, La Diosa, Charmont, Pondarosa Miss, Omei Sword, Alpine Eagle etc. Combining High Chaparral and Sir Tristram together in a pedigree again achieves reinforcement of such powerful mares as Selene, Lavendula II, Mumtaz Begum and Mumtaz Mahal — as well as sex-balanced duplication of stallions such as Princequillo and Mahmoud.

So, if you have a mare carrying either Pentire or Sir Tristram in her pedigree, sending her to Tivaci will enable you to tap into these very well-proven pedigree affinities that are supported by strong theoretical pedigree compatibility appeal. CORNER

Have visited Pearl Harbour along with thousands of Japanese. One can't help but wonder what they think. What a monumental stuff up the Americans made. They show a 20-minute clip of the events leading up to this infamous 2 hours, not impressive decision-making.

Funny thing though, wherever you go racing dogs you.

John Key shared the bus from plane to terminal, a bus trip he didn't know existed when Prime Minister. I suggested we should spend our 5 minutes to sort out racing; his blunt response was you need more money!

Surprise, walking out of the terminal I was pursued by Ray Thompson, a former owner of a number of both trotters and

gallopers. He asked why I was allowing the industry to die? I tried to explain, to no avail, that I certainly could not be accused of sitting on my butt in our efforts to improve our prospects.

Remember John Stubbs...a former big player in the industry? He shared dinner with us last night. You don't need me to tell you what direction the discussion went with his only racing interest in Australia now, including his punting.

All this in three days. I think being humiliated on the beach, where at least I am surrounded by beauty, is better than the constant humiliation of trying to justify why they should race in NZ. Oh well, I have my first surfing lesson this morning -how's that for positive thinking! Don't wait for the video.
