PINS PACKING PLENTY

On the first race day of the new Hong Kong season, the exciting **Pins** galloper **Packing Pins** took another step on his rapid rise to the top. He is now the winner of **5** of his **8** starts and won in such impressive fashion that he looks to have plenty more in store yet. He may well even progress to being the next **Pins** superstar in Hong Kong, following on from **Ambitious Dragon** and **Aerovelocity**. He is certainly an exciting horse to watch as the season progresses.

Packing Pins is bred on the successful cross of Pins over an O'Reilly mare. Horses bred on this cross are running at 8.2% SW/Rnrs and tend to be very consistent performers – as evidenced by the 73% winners/runners statistic, and the fact that these horses have already won 170 races between them, and have collective earnings of NZ\$8.2 million. The stakes winners bred on this cross so far have been Shopaholic, Icepin, Tootsie, Maritimo, Sharp Princess and Raid. It looks like it won't be long until Packing Pins joins this list.
