# Pedigree Pointers with GARETH DOWNEY

#### This River's On The Rise

Last Saturday was another day of high class stakes racing, and so it turned out to be another new stakes winner for **Savabeel**, and another bred on a proven pedigree affinity. **Adorabeel** picked up the **6th** win of her career, and her first at stakes level, when winning the **Gr. 3 Aspiration Handicap** over 1600m at Randwick.

This win gave **Savabeel** his **39th** stakes winner, his **11th** for this season alone, and his career record to date is now running at **9.4% SW/Rnrs**; which is an exceptional strike rate! Interestingly, **Plaza Doree** is out of a daughter of **Riverman** – so this is yet another example of the proven affinity between **Savabeel** and **Riverman**. From just **37** runners by **Savabeel** out of mares carrying **Riverman**, there have now been **7** stakes winners – so this pedigree pattern is running at a very high **18.9%** SW/Rnrs. The quality of stakes winner has also been particularly high. These stakes winners have been:
