out to make history for HONG KONG & NEW ZEALAND in

JAPAN'S GR.1 TAKAMATSUNOMIYA KINEN



Paul O'Sullivan has returned to the country of one of his greatest training triumphs with Sunday's **Gr.1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen (1200m)** at Chukyo Racecourse in Japan the ambitious goal set for star **Pins** qalloper **Aerovelocity.**

O'Sullivan and his father and then training partner Dave produced the great mare **Horlicks** [NZ] [Three Legs] to win the Gr.1 Japan Cup at the Tokyo racecourse in 1989. Ridden by brother, Lance, Horlicks not only carved her place as the first NZ-bred winner in the event, but she did so in world record time.

On Sunday, the Hong Kong-based trainer's charge **Aerovelocity** likewise faces a raft of unchartered territories.

In Sunday's Gr.1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen, the talented Pins 6YO gelding will be:

- Hong Kong's first contender
- The first NZ-bred contender
- The third overseas horse ever to fly in for the event
- The first overseas horse in 12 years to attempt to do so
- Having his first Gr.1 attempt at racing the left-handed way and on Chukyo racecourse's different turf surface.

"He's raced left-handed before (in New Zealand) and been successful but at G1 level it's a little bit of an unknown. As far as the rise on the track (at Chukyo) goes, again, unknown because he's sort of raced on the flat track his whole time—so those are the two things, going into the race, we're not too sure about," O'Sullivan told www.japanracing.jp yesterday.

"He's big and strong and he's got very good gait speed. He's also pretty versatile in his races—

he's also won coming from last this season—so if the pace is sedate, which is usually not the case here, he can make the pace, but he can also follow if some horses want to go in front. Basically I think he's a very courageous horse and we hope he can run to his very best, and if so he'll be very competitive."

Bred by Nelson Schick and Steve Till, **Aerovelocity** displayed his ability to defy odds two starts back, powering home to be the first NZ-bred winner of the Gr.1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint.



Owned by Ngai Daniel Yeung, **Aerovelocity** boasts eight wins from 16 starts, in addition to four seconds and a third.

Aerovelocity will be reunited with jockey Zac Purton in the Takamatsunomiya Kinen and will jump from barrier 4 with 57kg's on his back.





It's 12 months since New Zealand training great Trevor McKee and good friend Barry Rissetto celebrated success as the owners of the **Gr.1 Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes** winner **O'Marilyn** [O'Reilly].

Today McKee drives down to Awapuni with another **O'Reilly** filly on board hoping to repeat the dose in tomorrow's Gr.1 renewal.

Like **O'Marilyn**, the Stephen McKee-trained **O'Di-anne** is raced by himself and Rissetto – who has been a long-term stable client, and she will have the services of Sam Spratt aboard.

O'Dianne was a last start winner at Ellerslie and is rated the fourth elect for the event.



"She's been working extremely well, so hopefully, she should be able to work her way into the top three," said Trevor McKee.

PINS PACKING GLOBAL PUNCH

Pins is well-known as a leading international sire who consistently produces good quality, consistent and versatile racehorses who race well in all racing jurisdictions. This is evidenced by the fact he has twice taken out the **Centaine Award**; this being a measure of global earnings for progeny

of NZ-based stallions. **Pins** is again running a close 2nd on the **Centaine Award** for the current season, sitting on \$6.7 Million in progeny earnings, just \$200,000 behind **O'Reilly**.

During the last week, all of this has been on good display with **Pins** having **7** winners for the week, as well as a stakes placed performer. The greatest contributor to the earnings tally was the win of **Packing Pins** in Hong Kong. He continues to be a very promising performer, and this latest win takes his record now to **5** starts for **2** wins and **2** second placings. Such is his reputation in Hong Kong that he has actually started an odds-on favourite in all his starts, and he looks like he is destined for many more wins yet. Another high class



Hong Kong performer by **Pins** is **Aerovelocity** and he will endeavour to provide a substantial boost to the progeny earnings for **Pins** when he competes in the **Gr. 1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen** this Sunday.

In terms of pedigree patterns, **Packing Pins** is bred on the successful cross of **Pins** over an **O'Reilly** mare. The results of this cross to date are running at an impressive **8.8% Stakes Winners/Runners**, and **17.6% Stakes Placegetters/Runners**.

The consistent success of **Pins** in general is perhaps best highlighted by the fact that his career to date has produced **64** stakes winners at the rate of **7.7% SW/Rnrs**. That strike rate puts him in the very top echelon of proven stallions throughout Australasia. On the basis of this, he should be strongly considered as an excellent option to help give your mare the best possible chance of producing a high class runner...and that could be anywhere on the international stage.
