Denise Howell's dual **Gr.1** winning **Savabeel** mare **Soriano** could well have been trying to take a leaf out of her former stablemate **Costume's** book, when she visited **Pins** this week.

Last year after placing 12th in the **Gr.1 Windsor Park Plate**, the **Gr.1 Savabeel** mare **Costume** paid **Pins** a visit. It seemingly worked the oracle, as at

her very next start, she won the **Gr.1 Hawke's Bay Spring Classic** with her 2015 filly in-utero.

**Soriano**, who was awarded the **Champion Mid-dle Distance Horse in NZ** in 2014/15 for trainers Graeme and Debbie Rogerson, ran below expectations in last weekend's **Gr.1 Livamol Classic**, finishing 9th.

Whilst the decision is yet to be made as to **Soriano's** immediate plans ahead, if she was to continue racing, at the top of Howell's wishlist would be report vistories in the **Cr. 1** Table of Classic and the **Cr. 1** 

peat victories in the Gr.1 Zabeel Classic and the Gr.1 Herbie Dyke Stakes.





# One For the Vet WS Vet Care with Dr. Chris Phillips

At 3am, the radio went off, detailing a maiden mare in trouble at the Foaling Unit. The mare in question turned out to be Lorraine Jameson's dual **Gr.3** winning **Pins** mare **Karla Bruni** (pictured below).

Upon arrival, the outlook was not good. She presented with post foaling colic, recumbancy, very pale

mucous membranes, slow heart rate and non-responsive to external stimulation. The potential causes of which being a ruptured artery into her abdomen, a broad ligament haematoma, a ruptured uterus, or all three.

As the mare was collapsed, initial treatment comprised of shock fluid therapy, coagulant treatment and pain relief, all within ten minutes of her foaling her **Savabeel** colt. At this point it was a fight to preserve her blood volume without raising her blood pressure and thus increasing bleeding.



We thought we had lost the fight during this initial phase when **Karla Bruni** seemed to take her last breath. Thankfully with a six strong team alongside two resident vets, all dedicated to saving her life and with the mare's tough nature, she responded to our initial treatment. This team further aided in the next step to recovery, which was to get her standing and into our intensive care facility at Waikato Stud.



Here she was monitored continuously for the next seven days, whilst diagnostic procedures were performed and further treatment was administered.

As soon as she was in ICU, an abdominal ultrasound confirmed fluid within the abdomen, which was diagnosed as blood on peritoneal tap. A uterine bleed was concluded.

To compound **Karla Bruni's** life-threatening situation she also had a retained placenta, causing her temperature to spike, her to be uncomfortable and

to slowly develop signs of serious uterine infection.

Further treatment included pain relief, fluid therapy, blood transfusion, plasma transfusion, antibiotics, coagulant therapy, sedation, gastro-protectants and intensive care nursing.

A rectal palpation later confirmed a large right sided broad ligament haematoma and laboratory tests suggested she had lost up to a whopping 50% of her circulating blood into her abdomen. As a rule of thumb, the sickest of animals may lose over 25%.

Over the course of her week in ICU, Karla Bruni made fantastic progress. She responded very well to her treatment, with lots of help she passed her retained placenta, her cardiovascular parameters returned to within normal limits, her pain resolved, the blood in her abdomen reduced in volume and she and her colt were allowed out into the paddock



to graze. Her last blood (taken just last week) showed her blood parameters had returned to within normal limits.

Post-partum haemorrhage affects 2-3% of mares and is responsible for 40% of deaths following foaling.

In my opinion, Karla Bruni (seen above with her former trainer Roydon Bergerson this week) should not be alive. The most likely reason behind her not fulfilling this 40% statistic and being a massive success case was the speed within which she was receiving treatment post-bleeding, the excellent intensive care nursing, the huge team effort, and of course the mare's tough nature itself.



Waikato Stud's gem of a **Vet Locum**, **Julie Storme**, was seemingly born into the equestrian caper, with formative years taking place on a thoroughbred and show jumping stud farm in Ireland.

Straight from school, Julie did an undergraduate degree in **Pharmaceutical Chemistry** in England, before taking part in the **Irish National Stud Course** and travelling to New Zealand, where she worked two seasons in the Foaling Unit for **Windsor Park Stud**. In between these two seasons, Julie went to Lexington Kentucky, where she worked with well-known reproductive expert **Dr. Richard Holder**.

After also completing Sales work in Australia, New Zealand, England, Ireland and France, Julie commenced 4 years of study for a **Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine and Surgery** degree at Edenborough's **Royal Dick School** (true story – William Dick was the founder) **of Veterinary Studies**, where she graduated in June.




# 60 Seconds with... WS Vet Locum JULIE STORME

# Pedigree Pointers with Gareth Downey



#### PINS' STAR SHINES AT CAULFIELD

Tomorrow's **Gr.1 Toorak Hcp** hopeful **Stratum Star** picked up his 3rd stakes victory when taking out the **Gr.1 Sir Rupert Clarke Stakes** at Caulfield recently. In doing so, he also became the **2nd Gr.1** winner for **Pins** as a broodmare sire, joining the **Queensland Derby** winner **Brambles** as the other to achieve that distinction.

Pins is proving to be an exceptional broodmare sire. To illustrate just how good, if we look at only those broodmare sires whose daughters have produced at least 15 stakes winners in the southern hemisphere, Pins is sitting at 6.7% SW/Rnrs as a broodmare sire. If we rank these sires according to their % SW/Rnrs to date, this places him 2nd on the ranking list behind only O'Reilly, who is running at 7.0%. The next 3 on the list are Zabeel, Redoute's Choice and Last Tycoon – so we can see this is indeed an excellent way of identifying those truly elite broodmare sires in our part of the world.

The specific pedigree pattern of **Stratum Star** also highlights the success of combining **Pins** and **Redoute's Choice** together in a pedigree. When these **2** are brought together in a pedigree, it does create a sex-balanced duplication of the very influential sire Lunchtime. This seems to be working very well in practice, with the results overall running at **8.8% SW/Rnrs** when these **2** sires have been combined anywhere on opposite sides of a pedigree. Apart from **Stratum Star**, there has so far also been the **Gr. 2** winner **Sports Illustrated** as well as the stakes winner **Tomorrowland**.

Certainly helping **Gold Ambition's** odds of success for Bjorn Baker in the **Gr.1 Spring Champion Stakes**, is the fact that **Savabeel** himself won the race in 2004.
