Waikato Stud's bloodstock manager Kerrie Cox celebrated her first victory as an owner at Trentham last weekend.

Kerrie races the exciting Ocean Park two-year-old Miss Valencia with her husband Rob and Group One-winning Australian trainer Mick Kent.

The filly is trained for them by Johno Benner and Hollie Wynyard, who were expecting a bold showing off the back of a debut third last month. "She's a filly we've got a lot of time for and a typical Ocean Park, she's going to be much better at three," Wynyard said. "She went really well on debut and she's got quite a long sprint so we told Sam (Wynne) to get her into the open and rolling. She could to go to the paddock now, but we'll just wait and see how she comes through this race first." Miss Valencia raced on the pace and, after taking control 300m from home, she rounded off strongly to score by half a length. Runner-up Byzantine, a promising son of Savabeel, fought on gallantly for second after making the running.

The winner was signed for at Karaka in 2017 by Cambridge bloodstock agent Phill Cataldo for \$47,500. She is out of the Fastnet Rock mare Pastrana and the family of the Group 1 T. J. Smith Stakes winner Sizzling and the black type winner and Group 1 Golden Slipper placegetter Loving Cup.

Miss Valencia held a nomination for the Group 1 Courtesy Ford Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (1400m), but connections felt that may have been a step too far at this stage.

It's job done for the highly-regarded filly Miss Valencia, who has been rewarded with a break.

"She's a lovely filly and she won well, we felt a spell now was in her best interests," co-trainer Johno Benner said.

"It would have been too much of an ask for her, she's going to make a really nice three-year-old," Benner said.


Placed in the Group 3 Cambridge Breeders' Stakes last season, the David and Emma Haworth-trained for-yearold provided rider Sam Wynne with her fourth winner of the day. They settled midfield before improving across the top and rounded off powerfully in the run home.

The well-named Flamingo is out of the

Danasinga mare Bird, who won the Listed Warstep Stakes at Riccarton. She hails from a strong black type family which includes the Group Two winners and Group One performers Seraphic, Irlanda and Chintz.




