Savabeel three-year-old Queen Leonora has added her name to the family roll of honour in fine style.



She continued her steady improvement yesterday with her maiden success over 1600m at Bendigo.

The Danny O'Brien-trained filly had placed in two of her three starts before triumphing in the hands of James Winks.

Queen Leonora was bred by Waikato Stud and farm principal Mark Chittick has remained in the ownership.

She is out of the O'Reilly mare Lego, who is a sister to the stakes winner Wolfwhistle and a three-quarter sister to the Gr.1 WATC Derby winner Guyno.

Queen Leonora is a grand-daughter of the stud's dual Gr.1 Kelt Capital Stakes and New Zealand Oaks winner Legs.

It is also the family of the multiple Group One winner Xtravagant and the black type winners Arletty and Firetaine.









ROCK 'N' POP DOUBLES UP

Two promising three-year-old sons of Rock 'n' Pop credited their Waikato Studbased sire with a trans-Tasman double on Wednesday.

The Macallan furthered his record in fine style at Avondale while Boomtown Rat struck at Gosford.

Prepared at Cambridge by Tony Pike, the former has now won two of his four starts.

The Macallan is out of the Centaine mare Wee Tipple and is a halfbrother to the Group performers Who Dares Wins and Mae West.

Boomtown Rat also posted his second success from a handful of starts for Randwick conditioner Edward O'Rourke.

He is a half-brother to the Gr.1 Telegraph Handicap winner Irish Fling, their dam the O'Reilly mare Irish Belle.

The Gr.1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas winner Rock 'n' Pop is a son of Fastnet Rock and the former top racemare Popsy.

He has now produced winners in four countries, including the Group performers Gold Spice, Paris Rock and The Lord Mayor.

Trainer Roger James believes his promising three-year-old Hanger is finally starting to understand what the racing game is all about after he made it back-to-back victories when he took out the Fasttrack Insurance 1400 at Pukekohe.

The O'Reilly gelding has proven a frustration to his many supporters after taking seven starts to clear maiden ranks, but James was confident some hard work behind the scenes would pay dividends once the penny dropped with the horse.

"At home he's a horse that can run any sort of sectionals," he said.

"The key is that he's relaxing now as we've done a lot of work with him.

"He can now use that sprint he has when we need it rather when he wants to."

James had been concerned about the Heavy10 track on offer and was relieved to see Hanger handle the conditions well enough to register the victory.

"I wouldn't think he was completely at home on it," he said.

"I don't think he is well suited by these sort of tracks, but he just has an abundance of ability.

"He's not a big strong horse but he has the makings of a good horse going 1400m-1600m in future seasons."

Hanger is raced by Waikato Stud in partnership with Cambridge Stud principals Brendan and Jo Lindsay.

He is a son of O'Reilly and the Savabeel mare Do Ra Mi, whose three wins featured the Gr.2 Kewney Stakes.

She is a half-sister to the farm graduate Marju Snip, whose career highlight was victory in the Gr.1 Australasian Oaks.

Waikato Stud have purchased the retired black type winner and multiple stakes placegetter Starvoia.

Prepared at Balcairn by John and Karen Parsons, she was successful in six of her 16 starts and was placed on a further six occasions.

Starvoia was unbeaten in her first two starts as a three-year-old and then chased subsequent Gr.1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas winner La Diosa home when second in the Listed NZ Bloodstock Canterbury Belle Stakes.

She was also runner-up in the Listed Dunedin Guineas, the Listed Southland Guineas and the Listed NZB Insurance Stakes after being third in the Listed Gore Guineas.

Starvoia resumed with a fresh-up win

at Riccarton last November and also won her next two starts, culminating with her final victory in the Listed Hazlett Stakes on Boxing Day.

The curtain came down on her racing career when she finished seventh with a slipped saddle at Wingatui last month.

"She was a top mare and we didn't get to see the best of her," Karen Parsons said. "She was unlucky a lot of the time."

Starvoia is a daughter of the Waikato Stud-bred Starcraft, an Australian, New Zealand, English and French Group One winner.





Rock N Pop Rolling On

We are frequently hearing from trainers with progeny of Rock 'n' Pop that they are really happy with what they are seeing, and that they will just benefit from more time.

These comments are looking like being spot on, as we have been seeing some good momentum building with the Rock N Pop progeny in the last couple of months.

In the last week alone, there have been two winners by Rock N Pop. They both produced really nice efforts that showed quality and determination – and, in doing so, they both joined the list of multiple race winners sired by Rock N Pop so far. These winners were:

- **The Macallan** Won over 1400m at Avondale and took his record to 2 wins from 4 starts
- **Boomtown Rat** Won over 1600m at Gosford and took his record to 2 wins and 2 placings from 7 starts

Mares by Stravinsky – 2 winners at the rate of 5.5 starts/win

- Rock 'n' Affair 1 win from 3 starts
- Refresh As above

Mares carrying Centaine – 2 winners at the rate of 8.0 starts/win

- The Macallan As above
- Telecom Man Winner in Hong Kong

Mares by O'Reilly – 2 winners at the rate of 11.3 starts/win

- **Gold Spice** 1 win and 2 placings from 5 starts, including a 2nd placing in the Gr.3 Sunline Vase
- Boomtown Rat As above
