Champion New Zealand sire Savabeel gave us the 'One to Watch' on Wednesday with a sensational win for the three-quarter brother in-blood to triple Group I winner Sangster.

A phone call from Lindsay Park cotrainer David Hayes has led to exciting times for Kiwi owner breeders Peter Grieve and Barry Thomas.

The pair co-own and bred exciting three-year-old Gold Mag who took his unbeaten tally to two at Sandown on Wednesday.

The Savabeel gelding showed a tremendous turn of foot to sail past his opposition to score by five-lengths under jockey Craig Williams.

"He showed a great turn of foot and changed stride in the straight and was three-wide all the way," Grieve said. "I'm very happy with the win."

Gold Mag only had the one unplaced trial in New Zealand for trainer Finbarr Leahy before Grieve fielded a call from David Hayes.

"His trial in New Zealand was quite a good trial," Grieves said. "David Hayes rang me out of the blue and told me he had heard I had quite a nice horse and that he'd like to train him for me.

"I thought with that sort of initiative I'll give him a go."

It is a decision that Grieve has not regretted, with Gold Mag winning by a similar margin on debut at Bendigo in June, followed by Wednesday's impressive victory.

"They (trainers) are pretty excited. He's still got youth on his side, so we'll take him along slowly," he said.

"We'll just ease up on him now and bring him out in a couple of months time. He'll be a handy horse in 13 to 14 months."

Grieve, a 75-year-old former trainer, is excited to once again have a quality horse on his hands, but Gold Mag still has a way to go to top his list.

"It's good to have a nice horse on my hands again after 50 years in racing," he said.

"I've been keen on racing all my life. I had my first winner in 1969 and had a horse or two before that. I trained my first winner at Wellington in 1970, so I have been playing around with horses for a long time.

"I had a share in Omnicorp when he won the VRC Derby, but breeding, owning and training Braless to win the (New Zealand) One Thousand Guineas has probably been the highlight. Uncle Remus beat us by half a head in the (New Zealand) Two Thousand Guineas."

Meanwhile, Grieve said he is just as rapt for his breeding and owning partner Barry Thomas, who was made a Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit for services to tourism and business in the 2018 Queen's Birthday Honours.

"He sponsors the New Zealand Trotting and galloping Cups," Grieve said. "He's put a fair bit into racing.

"I met him through a review committee we were in, it was of New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing as a matter of fact. We got matey and began racing a few together." That has resulted in the pair breeding Gold Mag and Grieve hopes his future success can pay for his dam Chapinta to return to his sire this season.

"We'd probably be wise to go back to Savabeel (this coming season), we might be able to afford it by then."— NZ Racing Desk

RETIREMENT FOR SAVABEEL'S TOP-CLASS SON

Allan Sharrock was feeling both sad and relieved in the wake of his decision to retire Savabeel's best son Kawi. The New Plymouth trainer announced today that he had called time on the seven-year-old's illustrious career.

"We've had a ride and a-half with him and while it's a shame, I'm also relieved," Sharrock said.

"I know he's not quite right and he's had issues with his joints and his fetlocks are showing a bit of wear and tear. I'd hate to see anything happen to him so that's it.

"I'm not taking any risks, he's been such a great servant. He's the best I've had.

"He's been massive and people don't realise how hard it is to win seven Group Ones."

Kawi was successful in 15 of his 39

starts, but it was a close second that stood out in Sharrock's mind.

"He was great in those big races at Hawke's Bay, but I think his biggest effort was in the Telegraph," Sharrock said.

"He carried topweight and had he not been held up he might still have won. There was a bias toward the inside that day and he was down the middle.

"It's a shame we couldn't equal Mufhasa's record, but that's the way it goes sometimes."

Mufhasa heads the list of New Zealand Group One wins with eight and Kawi shares second with Seachange on seven.







PINS CONTINUES TO MAKE HIS MARK

Pins gained further posthumous international honours this week with a trio of winners in two countries.

His daughters Bella Amante and My Shu Mai struck in Australia while Flying Monkey furthered his record in Hong Kong.

The lightly-tried Bella Amante posted the third victory of her five-start career when she won at Kembla Grange on Thursday.

Bredandpart-owned by Little Avondale Stud she is out of the Zabeel mare Bellabaci, who hails from the family of Waikato Stud graduate and Gr.1 Australasian Oaks winner Marju Snip.

My Shu Mai's maiden success came at Sale on Thursday off the back of two previous placings.

The three-year-old is a daughter of the American-bred Flowerdrum, a Group Two winner in Australia.

Meanwhile, Flying Monkey won for the second time in Hong Kong on Wednesday evening.

He is out of the dual Group Two-winning Danehill mare Dandify, a daughter of the former champion filly and multiple Group One winner Mannerism.

Pins sadly passed away earlier this year due to complications from colic.

A Gr. 1 Australian Guineas winner for trainer Clarry Connors, he retired to Waikato Stud in 2000 and enjoyed an outstanding career.



His leading Australian performer was the Gr. 1 Cox Plate winner El Segundo, while in New Zealand his top-flight winners includes Katie Lee.

She made history in 2009 when she became the first horse to complete the New Zealand 2000 and 1000 Guineas double.

He also significantly contributed to the rise of the farm's current champion stallion Savabeel with an impressive 15 per cent of stakes winners to runners sired by Savabeel out of mares by Pins.

Jim Bruford - congratulations on purchasing Group One NZ Oaks winner Savvy Coup for Ray Coupland and the Pitman team, and congratulations to Albert Bosma of Go Racing for purchasing Group One 1000 Guineas winner Hashahalo for Go Racing's owners.

It has been a successful week for our past and present sires, but my winner of the week certainly goes to Savabeel three-year-old Gold Mag. Bred and raced by Peter Grieve and Barry Thomas, he was more than impressive and won by an easy five lengths at Sandown to remain unbeaten following a win by a similar margin at his last outing. It's fantastic to see Savabeel continuing to assert his dominance in Australia and it is great to see Peter following the advice of his bloodstock advisor sister Jenny to send Gold Mag's dam Chapinta to Savabeel a few years back to mate her on that successful Savabeel x High Chaparral cross!

I'm back on deck next week and am feeling particularly pumped about what the season ahead will hold. We are eagerly awaiting the arrival of Tivaci's first foals and if he leaves them anything like himself, which I have no doubt he will, we've got a lot to look forward to down the track. The feedback from breakers and trainers about Sacred Falls' yearlings has been excellent. They have great brains, are professional and are extremely athletic individuals so we can't wait to see them step out for the first time over the next few months.

The progeny of Ocean Park have really hit their straps with 26 of his 40 individual winners winning in Australia. He is the leading NZ based Australian Second Season sire and is the first NZ stallion to hold a top-five placing in eight years since High Chaparral. This season alone he has sired 7 stakes performers including Stakes winner Ocean Jewel and the runner-up in the Queensland Oaks, Gr.1 and NZ Derby, Gr.1. We're very happy with where he is at present and look forward to plenty more success to come.

It is evident that the progeny of Rock 'n' Pop needed a bit of time on their side and I am wrapped to see them coming into their own as they reach maturation. He has sired 14 individual winners in four different countries with 6 of these being in Australia. He has also produced four

Stakes performers to date including ARC Sunline Vase, Gr.3 runner-up Gold Spice and Go Dixie who was third in the recent Sunshine Coast Guineas, Gr.3.

Continuing his dominance as a sire, Savabeel remains one of only three current Australasian sires to maintain a stakes winner to runners' percentage above 10%. At the close of the 2017-18 season, Savabeel will claim his fourth straight New Zealand Sires Premiership, third consecutive Dewar Award and third Centaine Award and we couldn't be prouder of his achievements.
