

Waikato Stud celebrated international success on Sunday with four winners in three countries.

The home-bred and owned Tahi scored in Victoria while the Matamata farm was also to the fore in Hong Kong.

Ocean Park three-year-old Lucky Win Win and Goko, a son of the late O'Reilly, triumphed at Sha Tin.

And in Singapore, Savabeel five-yearold Song To The Moon posted his sixth win at Kranji.

Trained at Flemington by Danny O'Brien, Tahi is also by O'Reilly and is out of the Group One winner Glamour Puss. The four-year-old was returning from a month's break when successful at Sale for the second win of his six-start career.

Meanwhile, Lucky Win Win posted his breakthrough success in the hands of top Australian jockey Tommy Berry.

The gelding is a son of the Spectrum mare On The Board, a daughter of the Gr.1 Australian Oaks winner Miss Danehill.

A \$525,000 Ready to Run Sale purchase, Goko has now won twice in Hong Kong.

He is out of the Exceed And Excel mare Miraculous Miss, also the dam of the multiple stakes winner Avisto.

Song To The Moon, a \$230,000 Ready to Run Sale buy, is a son of the French Deputy mare White Mouse.







ROCK 'N' POP'S SON EXCELS IN GUINEAS

Promising three-yearold Go Dixie has earned a black type credit for his Waikato Stud-based stallion Rock 'n' Pop. The gelding successfully bridged the gap to black type company with a bold third in Saturday's Gr.3 Sunshine Coast Guineas.

Trained by Scott Morrisey at the Gold Coast, Go Dixie had broken his maiden at his lead-up run at Toowoomba.

He was taken to the front in the Guineas by rider Paul Hammersley and kicked on strongly to finish third behind The Bostonian.

Go Dixie was initially purchased as a yearling at Karaka for \$60,000 and on-sold for \$220,000 at the Ready to Run Sale.

He is out of the Cape Cross mare Cape Merlot and is a half-brother to the stakes performer Elusive Red.

Go Dixie hails from the family of the Gr.1 Victoria Derby winner Omnicorp and more recently the Gr.2 Travis Stakes winner Abidewithme.





BLACK TYPE FAMILY ENJOYS FURTHER SUCCESS

A family that has served Waikato Stud so well was again to the fore across the Tasman last week.

O'Reilly Cyrus advanced the winning tally at Doomben where she posted her fourth career success.

Prepared by Gold Coast conditioner Toby Edmonds, she was a dominant winner over 1350m in the hands of apprentice Jackson Murphy.

O'Reilly Cyrus is a daughter of the late O'Reilly and Dancing Mistress, who has an admirable record at stud. The Masterclass mare is also the dam of the stakes winners Seize The Moment and Savour The Moment.

Group One winners in the pedigree include O'Marilyn, Anacheeva and Headturner.

O'Reilly Cyrus was sold by Waikato Stud at Karaka in 2015 for \$100,000.







GALLANT BATTLEBORN ANOTHER ROCK 'N' POP WINNER

Waikato Stud graduate Battleborn struck the first winning blow of his career at Bendigo this afternoon.

Trained by Brent Stanley, the Rock 'n' Pop three-year-old was successful over 1400m for apprentice Mitchell Aitken.

Battleborn's victory was not unexpected as he had finished in the money in four of his previous six appearances.

He was bought out of the Matamata farm's 2016 Premier Sale draft at Karaka for \$210,000 by Cloud 9 Thoroughbreds and CB Bloodstock.

His dam Vanilla Sky won twice and the O'Reilly mare has also left the stakes winner and Group One performer Raid (Pins).

Battleborn's pedigree page further features the dual Australian Group One winner Stratum Star.

The Waikato Stud-based Rock 'n' Pop has now left 14 individual winners, including the black type performers Go Dixie, Gold Spice, Paris Rock and The Lord Mayor.




