SAVABEEL FILLY RULES AT HASTINGS

Savabeel's regally-bred daughter Queen Of Diamonds has staked her claim for the Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks in style.

She left no doubt she is the filly to beat in the classic with a victory on Wednesday afternoon in the Gr.2 Lowland Stakes at Hastings.

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman-trained three-year-old turned in a commanding performance to win with ease.

Rider Matt Cameron did everything asked of him and Queen Of Diamonds responded in sparkling style.

"It was a great ride and he took control of the race," Forsman said.

"The key was she didn't have the blinkers on and relaxed with cover down the back straight."

Queen Of Diamonds idled up to challenge 200 metres from home and went clear to put the issue beyond doubt.

A \$640,000 Karaka buy for the China Horse Club, she is a daughter of Love Diamonds from the legendary Eight Carat family.


Talented mare Rondinella became Ocean Park's ninth stakes performer with her gallant performance at Matamata on Saturday.

The mare is at her best on top of the ground and did particularly well to finish a close second on a wet track in the Listed Kaimai Stakes.

The winner of four of her previous nine appearances, Rondinella closed relentlessly to be beaten only a nose.

Trained by Roger James and Robert Wellwood the four-year-old's effort has her on target to chase higher honours.

The plan with the mare is to now head to Ellerslie for the Gr.1 Bonecrusher Stakes on the 8th of March.

In the colours of Waikato Stud, Anything But confirmed his promise by winning the \$10,000 Chooky's Auto Maiden 1400 metres at Pukekohe.

BELOW / Anything But Photo Credit: Race Images Photos A horse co-trainer Pam Gerard felt possessed natural ability from the outset, his continued mental maturity helped matters following a big finishing fourth on debut when running the fastest last 600m (34.1) a fortnight earlier at Te Aroha.

"He found the line very well last time for fourth over 1200 metres and stepping up to 1400 metres looked ideal," she said.

"We've been happy with his condition and his behaviour is continuing to improve with experience. Jake (Bayliss) does a lot of work with him at home, has ridden him at the trials and race day, and it's good to get the win for Waikato Stud.

"I was a little bit worried when he was well back on the corner, but a strong



tempo helped and the further he goes the better he will be."

A better draw (7) ensured a more economical trip for Anything But and he was able to position sixth on the inner behind a tearaway pacemaker. Still with plenty to do approaching the 300m, he quickened appreciably when sighting daylight and flattened out nicely to the line.

On footing with ideal cushion (Dead4), Anything But ran the 1400 metres in 1:25.4 and drifted in betting to return \$4.00 & \$1.60.

"He's still a bit hot but that was well behaved for him," Bayliss said. "He trotted around nicely and was good at the gates. He was happy to tuck behind them and his raw ability came out in the end and he proved too good.

"He's a good work in progress and could be some sort of horse if he can get his head space right. It will come. He relaxes nicely and I can see him getting out to a mile."

Anything But was bred by Celia Crawshaw, nee Chittick, and owned by Waikato Stud and Ballymore New Zealand.

A winner of three races to a mile in the U.K., dam But Beautiful is a daughter of high-class sprinter and excellent sire Pivotal (Cozzene). Anything But is a son four-time Champion Waikato Stud stallion Savabeel (Zabeel). A Cox Plate (Gr. 1, 2040m) winning three-year-old, Savabeel (Zabeel) instils incredible quality into his stock, proved himself to be one of the most versatile stallions in Australasia, and his record speaks for itself.

The son of Ocean Park remained unbeaten this preparation following his handicap success over 1500 metres at Rosehill on Saturday.

Seaway had resumed with a course and distance win for trainer Chris Waller earlier this month.

He was purchased out of Waikato Stud's Premier Sale draft to Karaka in 2016 by Star Thoroughbred's Denise Martin for \$210,000.

Seaway is a son of the One Cool Cat mare Miss Purrfection, also the dam of the multiple Singapore stakes winner Kiwi Karma.

Allan Sharrock is predicting a top future for his progressive Ocean Park filly Our Hail Mary. She mainatined her unbeaten record at Otaki on Saturday with victory in a 1200 metre age group event.

"That was terrific. She's a 2000 metre filly – she's out of a sister to Shez Sinsational," trainer Allan Sharrock said.

"She's looking for more ground now, she was off the bridle at the 700, and she was tenacious.

"The Wellington Guineas is coming up, we might have a look at that."

Sharrock purchased Our Hail Mary at Karaka for \$35,000 – "I think I stole her," he said. The presence of the multiple Group One winner Shez Sinsational aside, it is a striong pedigree.

It also features the Group One winner Brutus and the stakes winners Demon Queen and Visionary.

Concert Hall raced in midfield and when cut loose by rider Matt Cameron she boomed home to win by nearly five lengths.

She is a daughter of Classic Legacy, a winning mare by Carnegie who hails from a particularly good female family. It includes the Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks winner Tartan Tights and the Gr.1 South Australian Oaks winner Lee's Bid.


