Leading New Zealand trainers Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman have gained a consolation win at the Sydney carnival with Savabeel's talented son The Chosen One.

An unlucky fourth in the Gr.1 Australian Derby, the three-year-old was a dominant winner of Saturday's Gr.3 Frank Packer Plate.

Forsman said the team would not be tempted by the Brisbane winter carnival with the colt to be aimed at bigger races in the spring.

"He has been up a long time but he keeps improving," Forsman said. "He's a quality bred colt, just maturing at the right time. It was great to see him get his just desserts.

"Brisbane would be tempting, but hopefully he's got bigger fish to fry in the spring. You can't do it everywhere.

"We had two big runs in the Derby but hadn't had a winner in the carnival, but they raced well enough so it was good to get the result."

Winning jockey Blake Shinn said the win showed The Chosen One's true ability.

"It is a consolation for the Derby," he said. "The Derby was a little bit frustrating. We were the victim of a wide barrier and had to take him back.

"I thought his run was arguably the best run in the race and he brought that form here. "We made another searching run on him, but we were coming back 400 metres so I was mindful of that.

"He is a lovely horse and it is great to win for Murray Baker and Andrew. It is my first winner for them so hopefully, it is the start of a good association."

It's been raining winners for multiple champion sire Savabeel with a haul of seven in the past week. The Waikato Stud's resident's son The Chosen One led the charge with a stunning victory in the Gr.3 Frank Packer Plate at Randwick.

Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman's regally-bred colt is now spelling ahead of a Melbourne spring carnival campaign

The roll continued across the Tasman with the Bryce Heys-trained Subban continuing his winning habit.

The four-year-old now has five victories from 11 appearances, the latest on the Kensington track at Randwick.

Bred by the stud and part-owned by Mark Chittick, he is a grandson of the multiple Group One winner Glamour Puss.

Savabeel's son Savaheat, trained by Mick Price, was successful for the third

time when he scored over 1800 metres at Sandown.

And Chris Waller looks to have a progressive filly in Lady Cuvee, her win at Kembla Grange was her second from just eight appearances.

Completing the Australian haul was Jennibeel, who showed staying potential when successful for the first time over 2000 metres at Wangaratta.

At home, Stephen Marsh's gifted filly Santa Catarina strolled to victory at Ellerslie last weekend.

She will be on the quick back-up in Saturday's Gr.3 Cambridge Breeders' Stakes in a bid to complete a hat-trick of wins.

He won for the fourth time from 12 starts when a dominant last-start winner at Randwick at the weekend.

The four-year-old is trained by John, Michael and Wayne Hawkes for prominent owners Max Whitby and Neil Werrett.

Mahalangur was bought out of the Matamata farm's 2016 Premier Sale draft for \$200,000.

He is a son of O'Reilly and the Pivotal mare But Beautiful, who was successful three times up to 1600 metres in England.

She is a half-sister to the dual

European stakes winner Ayrad and a well-performed European family.

It features the former champion sprinter Stravinsky, who was subsequently such an Australasian influence at stud.

The classy mare was a close second behind fellow Savabeel mare Nicoletta in the Group 1 New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes last time she was presented to the races and should be a force to reckon with in tomorrow's Group 2 Travis Stakes at Te Rapa. The Ken and Bev Kelso and Mark Donoghue trained mare will take on Nicoletta again here and has drawn just inside of her in barrier 8.

SANTA CATARINA GROUP 3 CAMBRIDGE BREEDERS

In-form Savabeel filly Santa Catarina has been going from strength to strength and has won her last two starts with ease. Trained by Stephen Marsh, she has won four races to date, including a Stakes race as a two-year-old and has only ever been unplaced in two of her 10 starts. She will make the step back up to Stakes level for the first time since the spring when she takes on some of the countries best three-year-olds in tomorrows Group 3 Cambridge Breeders' Stakes at Te Rapa. The track conditions at Hawkesbury tomorrow (currently good track) should be much more to his liking and adding to that, and he has drawn the inside gate. The son of Savabeel will be ridden by top jockey James McDonald for the Chris Waller Stable.
