The familiar Waikato Stud colours were in winning action at Hawkesbury on Thursday afternoon where Saving furthered his record.

The progressive three-year-old was successful for the second time in his brief career with a victory over 1600 metres.

Saving is trained by John O'Shea and was ridden by Rachel King and is a son of Savabeel and Spending.

The dam is a daughter of Pins and won up to 1000 metres and was runner-up in the Listed Creswick Stakes.

Spending is a sister to the Group winners Shopaholic and Packings Pins

and a half-sister to another Group winner in Splurge.

They are out of the Gr.3 Thoroughbred Club Stakes winner and Gr.1 Ascot Vale Stakes runner-up Splashing Out. It is a true blue Waikato Stud family with Splashing Out a three-quarter sister to multiple Group One winner and resident sire Sacred Falls.

Trainers Ciaran Maher and David Eustace recently produced the gelding for a dominant eight length first-up win at Ballarat over 1400 metres.

The son of Ocean Park got the job done in a style that strongly suggests he will make his way through the grades.

Purchased for \$80,000 out of Waikato Stud's draft at Karaka, Killavally is a son of Enjoy.

She is an unraced O'Reilly mare and a daughter of the dual stakes winner Playful Fingers.

It is most notably the family of Hancock Park and her daughter Park Lane, both Group winners in South Africa.

The Waikato Stud-bred and sold My Boss is proving a tidy piece of business for his Singapore owners.

He was purchased by Asian World Racing for \$7500 and that investment has now been more than quadrupled.

After a handful of starts, the son of Rock 'n' Pop broke through at Kranji over 1400 metres.

The three-year-old is out of the Pins mare Be Fabulous, a sister to the stakes winner and Group performer Keano.

Be Fabulous' third dam is the Gr.1 Golden Slipper Stakes winner Courtza, mother of the champion sire O'Reilly.

Don't Worry is out of the good producer Burnzees Magic, who won six races.

She is the dam of the stakes winner Barbaric and a family that has hit the heights overseas.

It includes the champion South African filly Petrava, whose daughter Hoeberg was a Group One winner and son Jallad an influential sire.

Petrava is a daughter of the Gr.1 Railway Handicap winner Silver Liner

Killavally was impressive winning on debut by 8L at Ballarat on Sunday.

Bred by the stud he is a 3yo Ocean Park gelding out of the O'Reilly mare Enjoy (ex Playful Fingers by Defensive Play).

Ocean Park over an O'Reilly mare gives us a 4 x 4 cross duplication of Pompeii Court and a 5 x 4 of Hunza, via the blood sisters Eastern Princess and Courtza (dam of O'Reilly).

It's an interesting talking point, line breeding in this fashion, will it work, won't it work? The winners to runners on the nick are just fair at present averaging 53% whilst it is worth noting that Arrogant who put up a timeform rating of 120 in the Rosehill Guineas is also out of an O'Reilly mare.

Last Tycoon was a nice nick under Thorn Park so there's no doubt some influence present; Rondinella, King Opie, Ocean Deep and Fabric

support this. Defensive Play was super under the Zabeel sireline so that can only be helping here too.

Mark has always had a gut feeling this family would kick on with another top horse. After watching Killavally's win and also Shoshone the other week (Sacred Falls ex Dee I Why ex Playful Fingers) we might need to listen to his gut more often!

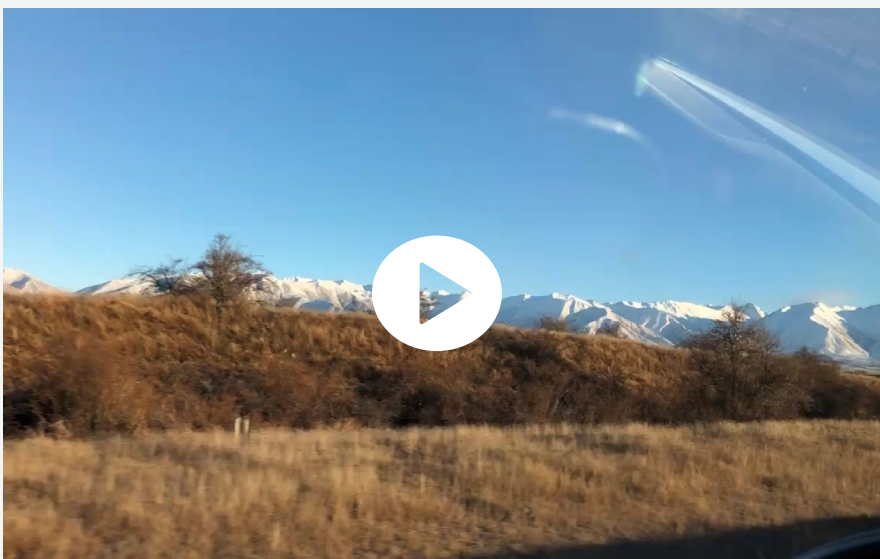
