

Blesk a colt to follow

JOHN O'SHEA HAS A QUALITY THREE-YEAR-OLD ON HIS HANDS IN BLESK AND THE RANDWICK TRAINER HAS LOFTY FUTURE GOALS IN MIND FOR THE SON OF SAVABEEL.

Bred and part-owned by Waikato Stud, he did exactly what was expected of him when successful on debut at Goulburn.

"He's a very exciting colt and we've liked him all the way through, so it's nice to get the first one on the board. He's got a bright future," O'Shea said.

"We were really bullish about him and he's got a lovely turn of speed."

O'Shea said he will take Blesk along quietly in the coming weeks before getting more serious next year.

"We'll continue to educate him and get some mileage into his legs during the Spring with a view to the Guineas in the Autumn."

Blesk is a son of Sparkling, an O'Reilly mare, who is a sister to the dam of the Group One winners Diademe and Embellish, and is a half-brother to Espumoso, who as Regency Legend is unbeaten in Hong Kong.

She's highly-regarded by the stable and holds a nomination for next month's Gr.1 Flight Stakes in Sydney.

By Savabeel, the three-year-old hails from one of our best families as a daughter of Hollywood, a Pins mare out of the two-time Group One winner Glamour Puss, whose half-brother Vision And Power also claimed a pair of top-flight victories.


Waikato Stud's Community Champions
