

Ocean Park -riding the crest of a wave

OCEAN PARK HAD A WHALE OF A WEEKEND WITH SIX WINNERS ACROSS THREE COUNTRIES AND ONE OF THEM NOW LOOMS A TOP EPSOM HANDICAP PROSPECT TO GIVE OUR STALLION HIS FIRST VICTORY AT THE HIGHEST LEVEL.

The Chris Waller-trained Kolding, winner of last season's Gr.2 Queensland Guineas, earned his boarding pass for the Group One feature with an impressive victory in the Gr.2 Bill Ritchie Handicap at Randwick.

"He's in with a winnable weight (50.5kg) and there's a sense of timing, it's the race he's been set for after winning the race at Eagle Farm, the Queensland Guineas," Waller said.

"He's a really nice horse, he showed that at the end of the autumn with the three races in a row that he won."

Our colours were also carried to victory at Caulfield by Fabric, trained by our long-time friend and supporter Danny O'Brien.

"It's a relationship we've had for a long, long time with Waikato Stud and they're in the top three studs in Australasia," O'Brien said. "They're a sensational operation and any horse you get from them, there's a fair chance it will be a good horse".

O'Brien said "Fabric would now get her chance to step up to stakes level in the Gr.2 Blazer Stakes (1400m) at Flemington on October 5".

"She's a filly that showed good promise as a three-year-old, but she's come back a bit bigger and stronger."

Fabric is a daughter of Haberdashery, is a half-sister to Hope So and her son by Ocean Park is King Opie, who posted his fifth career success in the Centenary Cup at Sha Tin for trainer Frankie Lor. A multiple Group 1 winner, the former New Zealand Horse of the Year was purchased by Garry Chittick who was determined she remained on our shores at the end of her decorated racing carer.

"Garry was committed to stopping the flow of quality bloodstock out of New Zealand and obviously bred her to one of Australia's best stallions. He's been well rewarded with a beautiful filly, a great result," Mark Chittick said.

The filly will be retained by Garry and Bonneval will be served this season by resident champion stallion Savabeel.

Two other beautifully-related fillies are also among the latest flurry of foals to have been welcomed to the farm.

Group One winner Daffodil has produced a stunning daughter by Savabeel while a half-sister by Almanzor to the two-time Group 1 winner Bostonian also a quality foal. The dam Keepa Cheval is a half-sister to the former dual New Zealand Horse of the Year Mufhasa, successful 10 times at Group One level.

Daffodil is a real favourite of ours and she was a super mare, winning the Australian Oaks, New Zealand 1000 Guineas and the Windsor Park Plate at the elite level.

"It's such a busy and exciting time of the year and the team on the farm is doing a great job with all the new arrivals," Chittick said.





Breeding season is off to a cracking start out on the farm and it's all hands on deck. We're lucky enough to welcome back Assistant Veterinarian, Joanna Smythe, who has recently returned to the farm after taking a few months off since working her first breeding season in New Zealand at Waikato Stud last year.

What is your background and how did you get involved in horses?

I grew up on a farm in England and always had horses, so I spent my holidays galloping around stubble fields, eventing and hunting.

What is your role at Waikato Stud and what does it involve?

I am the Assistant Vet, which can involve everything from routine checks on new-born foals, bandaging yearlings, treating sick foals, to mare reproductive work and foaling's.

How long have you worked as a vet?

I graduated in 2013 and worked in farm and equine practice for 3 years, before moving to Newmarket and working at Rossdales Equine Hospital, working with a mix of thoroughbreds and sport horses.

How did your appointment to Waikato Stud come about?

I've always been keen to work at a stud during a Southern Hemisphere season and decided I wanted to come to New Zealand rather than Australia. Waikato Stud were advertising for an Assistant Vet and Chris Phillips (Head Veterinarian) and I both worked at the same practice in England.

This is your second stint at Waikato Stud, what made you want to return for a second season?

My first season gave me great experience from a work perspective. The size of the stud gave me opportunities I wouldn't have had at home to expand my skill set - so I am keen to build on that with a second season. On a personal level, I loved New Zealand and the people I worked with on the stud, so I am very happy to return!

What have you been doing since finishing up your first stint at Waikato Stud in February?

After the Karaka Sales, I had some time off to explore the South Island and Australia for a few weeks. I then headed back to the UK for the stud season, returning to Rossdales and working at three Thoroughbred studs, whilst also doing sports horse AI (Artificial Insemination) work with mainly eventing and show jumping mares.

What are you most looking forward to about this season?

I love doing the foal work, which despite the occasional frustration can be hugely rewarding. Being able to see last year's crop of foals develop all the way through to the sales ring is very exciting. A huge amount of work from the whole team goes into the whole process from conception to sales yearling and it is great to be a part of that.
