

OUR UNWAVERING FAITH IN OCEAN PARK WAS REWARDED AT RANDWICK WHERE THE CHRIS WALLER-TRAINED KOLDING DELIVERED AN OVERDUE GROUP ONE VICTORY FOR THE STALLION IN THE EPSOM HANDICAP.

It's been a case of so near and yet so far on a number of occasions for the former New Zealand Horse of the Year with his sons, Arrogant and Mongolian conqueror both suffering narrow defeats in the Gr.1 Rosehill Guineas and Gr.1 New Zealand Derby respectively.

To add to that, his daughter Another Dollar just failing to win a Gr.1 Queensland Oaks and Rondinella's multiple Group One placings, it was a well-deserved milestone achieved and well celebrated here!

"Three of them got beaten in bob of the head finishes in Group Ones so it was due for Ocean Park," Mark Chittick said. "Chris Waller has also had a lot of faith in the stallion. He's been a great supporter and continues to purchase his yearlings.

"Like the sire himself, I feel his horses can cop the work and they are very genuine."

Adding to the Epsom result was the terrific run for third of the winner's stablemate Star of The Seas, another progressive performer for Ocean Park.

Kolding, who won last season's G1 Queensland Guineas, perfectly executed a long-term plan.

"He had a winnable weight and there was a sense of timing, it's the race he'd been set for after winning the race at Eagle Farm," Waller said.

"He's a really nice horse and he showed that at the end of the autumn with the three races in a row that he won."

Kolding was bought for \$170,000 at Karaka out of Wentwood Grange's draft

and the year his dam was served by Ocean Park the Hawkins family sent two other mares to Waikato Stud.

The other resulting foals are the stakes winner and Group 3 placegetter Elate (Savabeel) and the Australian metropolitan winner Savigne (Ocean Park).

"Wentwood Grange is a very good and successful thoroughbred operation," Chittick said. "We met up with the family this week and had a whisky to congratulate them."

Kolding was purchased at the sale for Waller by bloodstock agent Guy Mulcaster, who knows Chittick through a 'working association' turned firm friendship.

"Guy and I go back a long way. We went to boarding school together at St Patrick's College at Silverstream and he was a bit older than me as most people would have worked out," Chittick said.

"I was his lackey and had to make his bed, clean his shoes, clean his rugby boots and be his caddy on the golf course."

With a number of progressive young horses in leading stables, Ocean Park is well-placed to build on his stake's success.

The Group Two placed pair of Oceanex and Tofane are one pair capable of making their mark during the spring carnival in Australia, our biggest market and where Ocean Park has produced an impressive 59 winners from 97 representatives.

In all countries, he currently has a winning strike rate of better than 58 per cent.

Ocean Park is also sitting at the top of the Dewar and Centaine Stallion Awards and that's a major feat as our own secondplaced Savabeel has dominated both divisions, and the Grosvenor Award, for years.

Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young have done a fantastic job with the Savabeel filly and her last-start success in the Gr.2 Thousand Guineas Prelude was a dominant front-running performance. Hopefully, she can keep stretch her winning run at Caulfield.

The Danny O'Brien-trained Fabric (Ocean Park) beat subsequent stakes winner, Haut Brion Her at Caulfield while stablemate, My Pendant (Pins) has also been in very good form. West Wind (Pins) is going from strength to strength for Ciaron Maher and David Eustace, winning on debut and then following up last weekend to remain unbeaten.

The Ciaron Maher and David Eustaceprepared Magazine (Savabeel) was an impressive last-start winner and takes her black type chance in the Listed Hill Smith Stakes at Morphettville while
