

Acting's success typifies the challenging breeding game

ACTING'S RAPID ASCENT TO GROUP GLORY HAS BEEN A BITTERSWEET Ride for the stud as she was the last foal produced by the PINS mare hollywood.

The dam subsequently succumbed to laminitis so it was an obvious decision to retain the filly and it proved a wise choice with her dominant win in the Gr.2 Thousand Guineas Prelude putting her firmly on target for the Gr.1 Thousand Guineas.

"It was a shame to lose such a young mare, but we all know that's what can happen in this business," Mark Chittick said. "Obviously, we decided to keep the filly and it's all looking pretty exciting now."

Hollywood won three races herself, including a metropolitan success in Melbourne, and has also produced the multiple winner Star of O'Reilly.

Acting, by Savabeel, is from a family that has served the farm so well for many years, dating way back to the Thorndon Park days, as her second dam is the two-time Group 1 winner Glamour Puss.

She is a half-sister to Vision And Power, also successful twice at the highest level, and a pedigree that further features the Gr.1 Coolmore Classic winner, Steps In Time and more recently the stakes winner and Group performer, Bonny O'Reilly.

Trained by Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young, Acting has won three of her four starts and the stable's private belief that she was the best horse in the yard went public at Caulfield where she came off a Benchmark 64 win at Sandown to thump her Group Two rivals with a commanding front-running performance. That said, they did overlook a payment to keep her in the Thousand Guineas which has since been rectified.


"It's been paid, Trent and Natalie earned the late entry fee and some more last Sunday," Chittick joked.

Tommy Berry guided Acting to her impressive last-start win, but suspension has counted him out of Thousand Guineas day and Craig Williams has been booked to partner the filly.

OUR MULTIPLE CHAMPION SIRE Savabeel continues to make his presence felt and he's now into the nineties as he approaches that magical mark of 100 stakes winners.

"He's been such a wonderfully successful servant of the farm and we've no doubt he'll bring up his century in double quick time. He's got excellent prospects this weekend of adding to his tally of 18 individual Group One winners," Mark Chittick said.

Savabeel, who went to 90 black type winners courtesy of the Waikato Stud-

bred and raced Acting in the Gr.2 Caulfield Thousand Guineas Prelude, will be represented by our home-bred Probabeel in the Gr.1 Flight Stakes at Randwick, and Kaonic is a genuine lightweight chance in the Gr.1 Epsom Handicap.

Probabeel was just pipped in the Gr.2 Tea Rose Stakes over 1400 metres and trainer Jamie Richards said the step up to 1600 metres will be ideal for her.

"She's peaking at the right time and we're looking forward to the race." The Chris Waller-trained stakes winner Kaonic drew serious attention to his Epsom chances, in which he will carry just 50kg, when he charged home for fourth in the Gr.3 Cameron Handicap.

"I genuinely think he's a lightweight chance," Waller's General Manager Charlie Duckworth said. "He was terrific in the Cameron and the track is likely to race as a genuine 4. That will be in his favour, he likes to get his toe in, and Andrew Gibbons can do the weight easily."

ON THE FARM



CATCHING UP WITH DR. CHRIS PHILLIPS

This week we catch up with Waikato Stud resident Veterinarian Chris Phillips to see how breeding season has kicked off...

With 90 mares foaled and 60 mares tested in-foal before the end of September, the start of the season has been fantastic.

A mild winter, excellent pasture and plenty of pre-season preparation has seen us cover over 70 percent of our dry mares and with 45 already tested in foal. The stallions are covering exceptionally well. Pre-season treadmill exercise, well-teased mares and a wonderfully relaxed atmosphere in the breeding shed are all contributing factors to the boys achieving a fantastic average per cycle pregnancy rate of 72 percent for the start of the season. Overall, our percentage of mares sixteen days covered or more tested in foal is sitting at 85 percent, a brilliant result which makes the life of an on-farm vet considerably more relaxed!!



My Pendant (Pins x My Locket) Group 2 Blazer Stakes

Only 1.5L of them in her last start, the Group 2 Let's Elope Stakes. She was bred in partnership with Fawcett/Wright and retained by the stud. Same race as Fabric (Ocean Park).

Probabeel (Savabeel x Far Fetched) Group 1 Flight Stakes

The Jaime Richards trained daughter of Savabeel flew home last start. Small field huge chance.

Fabric (Ocean Park x Haberdashery) Group 2 Blazer Stakes

First crack at black type. Won well last start. Bred and raced by the stud and in same race as My Pendant (Pins).

Kolding (Ocean Park x Magic Star) Group 1 Epsom Handicap

The Chris Waller trained gelding is equal favourite. Won last start, light weight and big chance.
