



They got what they were yearning for!

CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL CONCERNED WITH THE GRAND MARE YEARN, Savabeel's latest black type winner following her deserved success in the G2 Auckland Thoroughbred Breeders' stakes at pukekohe.

She'd previously been placed in three stakes races, including a close third in the Gr.2 Easter Handicap at Ellerslie.

With the benefit of a resuming run for second under her belt, the consistent six-year-old got the job done last Saturday under a fine Sam Spratt ride for trainer Karen Fursdon.

"She's just a wonderful mare," Fursdon said. "She's been tough but I have to thank Lisa Tynan, who does all the work on her and has put in a wonderful effort along with all the team back at home.

"It was a very awkward draw, but it was a lovely ride by Sam as while she was three-wide, she had cover.

"When Mark gave me this mare to look after it was just for four weeks, but she won two races and then a third."

Fursdon was referring to Mark Lupton, who races the mare with his wife Cath, and who placed Yearn with her when he went overseas in 2017.

"Everyone was telling him she (Fursdon) has locked the gate although I did say to him that if he wanted her back, he was to take her as she is yours, but I have been able to keep her which is just great," Fursdon said.

Mark Lupton was quick to pay tribute to the conditioning skills of Fursdon in the wake of her latest success. "I was just thrilled for Karen as we are great friends with her and husband Kevin," he said. "They don't have a big or celebrated team, but they are wonderful horse people so to be able to share in a victory like this is very special.

"I gave her to Karen and told her I would take her back when I got home, but she won two while we were away and another straight after so there didn't seem to be any point in taking her off Karen.

'That's another good decision I made and it has panned out so well for us all."
