
Lot 45 - **Super Seth** (AUS) x **Pink Graffiti** (NZ) colt \$470,000




3YO The Jewel. Thank you to Guy Mulcaster and Chris Waller, we look forward to following this colt's career - he is in the right place!

Lot 327 - Savabeel (AUS) x Urban (NZ) filly \$400,000





Well, another year gone, I am not the recipient of a lot of loot at Xmas but look forward to the next crop of two-year-olds by our sires to hit the tracks. The progeny of any new sire generates and the expectation of new excitement. We have introduced only five new prospects then four for the following season, and, dare I say, one new sire in 2023. Without wanting to be dramatic, these numbers are catastrophic. We all understand the likelihood of developing an elite prospect, despite the best will in the world, is at best five percent. Even then, there have been years when well in excess of twenty prospects in Australasia have failed to produce an elite sire.

So, whilst we have in the past had the stimulation of weighing up the established against the aspiring we will need to hope one of the ten reaches an acceptable level.

Our friends across the Tasman still have the investors securing young colts, we will as always keep them on their toes when, against the odds, races will still be shared by our progeny.

How did we arrive at such a perilous situation relatively quickly? I am afraid to say I believe it is a result of negative leadership. Yes, the redevelopment of Ellerslie is far from negative, hand on heart do you believe this upgraded facility will result in upgraded investment in broodmares, more importantly, how easy would it be now, to syndicate a \$10 m Group One winner?

Entain are on the right track, their definition of excitement is light years ahead of NZTR. Their need is for product, the perception of where we need to head could have been enacted earlier, but the

difference when you are profit-driven is plain for all to see.

I look forward to this year's Karaka Million, it is not the two year old race but the support races for the developed horses which NZ is renowned for. The addition of the race for four-year-olds will allow our best to show their wares.

We at Waikato don't race many at two, we are not anti-two-year-old racing, it just doesn't fit in our pattern, perhaps we have too many in work, and it is economics, but when you think about it, we don't qualify for the restricted entry races. The later development of our team doesn't seem to have affected results in the next years, having said that, I looked at the results of those who performed well in the January race, the likes of Cool Aza Beel, On the Bubbles, Avantage, Melody Belle, Rudd Awakening and what about the mighty Probabeel, certainly were not disadvantaged by racing at two.

This year of the top twenty at this stage, eight have won a race, half of the twenty are by Australian sires, of the sixteen previous winners, ten were by NZ sires, let's hope we can add to that record, Te Akau have won the last seven - a remarkable accomplishment.

We have a lot ahead of us, I hope you enjoyed a Christmas and New Years break. We have a number racing, just not two-year-olds, I Wish I Win is back in work, we look forward to his Autumn, Skew Wiff is in great shape, Mazzalino in foal will race until no longer allowed, so the eleven of you can follow our colours hopefully with confidence.

The refitted heart is ready for more excitement, Mark currently had Covid, has recovered now, the rest of us steered well clear and so far have dodged a bullet.
